Career and Technical Education

Career and Technical Education offers students an opportunity to learn skills they may use in high school, in a career after graduation and/or as a financial means to help further education. In addition, Career and Technical Education is designed to provide students the opportunity to make informed occupational choices, determine educational needs and options, develop employability traits, and acquire marketable skills. The Career and Technical Education courses are described in the information that follows. The Garland Independent School District offers Career and Technical Education Programs in many of the 16 career clusters. Admission to these programs is based on:

Career interests, Age appropriateness, Class space available, Prerequisites and aptitude for the program, and Adherence to school rules and regulations.

Garland Independent School District is supportive of the state plan based on the Public Education Career and Technical Education Goals established by the 74th Legislature in TEC §29.181:

Each public school student shall master the basic skills and knowledge necessary for:

- (1) managing the dual roles of family member and wage earner; and
- (2) gaining entry-level employment in a high-skill, high-wage job or continuing the student's education at the postsecondary level.

COURSE GUIDE FOR SPECIAL EDUCATION MIDDLE AND HIGH SCHOOL PROGRAMS

ORGANIZATION

This course guide is not meant to stand alone, but is a supplement to the GISD High School and Middle School Course Guides. The special education program essentially follows the same requirements as are listed in those course guides. A four year plan for each eighth grade student should be developed with the school counselor and discussed in the annual ARD meeting prior to the student's fourteenth birthday.

The first section of this course guide provides the special education courses offered at the middle school level. A complete list of the middle school special education courses is followed by a brief description of those courses.

The high school course guide immediately follows the middle school guide with the same organization. However due to the complexity of scheduling classes at the high school level, a proposed sequence of CBC and LIFE classes follows the high school guide.

In the secondary ABC and BASE classes, the only course offered is the Personal Social Skills class.

The four special education areas that are addressed in both the middle and high school special education course guide are:

- BASE Behavior Academic Support Environment
- CBSE Campus Based Special Education
- L.I.F.E. Learning in a Functional Environment
- VAC Vocational Adjustment Classes
- ABC Adaptive Behavior and Communication
- CBC Cooperative Behavior Center

Both the CBC and CBSE classes are not meant to provide complete educational programs to a student. The expectation is that students will earn most of their credits in the regular education class before and after leaving the CBC program. Classes in the CBSE program are meant to support those areas of greatest need with most classes completed in the regular education program. Additional support in the regular education program is provided through helping teacher and CM (Content Mastery). Credit for coursework is earned in regular education rather than in special education.

L.I.F.E. classes can provide a complete program for a student, or a selection of L.I.F.E. classes may be made by the ARD committee based on the student's individual needs. Students with skills at a functional level are candidates for L.I.F.E. classes.

Vocational Adjustment classes are provided to students who need more support than may be expected in regular education career and technology classes. Many students in special education are usually able to succeed in the regular education career and technology classes while students attending an ABC/BASE, CBC or L.I.F.E. program may take advantage of the VAC class upon ARD committee approval.

CHOICE OF SCHOOL

Campus assignment for students will be based upon whether a campus:

- a. has an appropriate program,
- b. has space available, and
- c. is the closest campus to the student's home which satisfies a and b above.

Should there be multiple schools with an appropriate program and classroom space available, the student's parents may make a choice of school following the GISD Desegregation Order guidelines. This must be documented as part of the ARD committee report.
