Please Note:

These are general guidelines that are common from school to school. Each campus may have additional dress code requirements which prevail. Questions about a specific standardized dress item should be directed to the individual campus.



All students may choose from:

- Red, navy, or white polo-style shirts (short or long sleeve, no logos)
- Red, navy or white sweaters or sweatshirts
- Navy or khaki slacks or shorts (no cargo-style slacks or shorts; shorts must be modest length, approximately 2 inches above the knee or longer)
- Shoes and socks (tennis shoes, loafers, dress shoes, or other closed-toe shoes) Tennis shoes will be necessary for physical education classes.
- Belts (usually preferred; check with individual campus for specific requirements)

Girls may also choose:

- Navy, khaki or plaid skirt, skort, capris or jumper (skirt, skort or jumper should be of modest length—approximately 2 inches above the knee or longer; plaids should be a red/blue combination)

Students are expected to arrive at school dressed appropriately for each school day. Each school has the option to choose specific days when alternative clothing may be worn.

(Examples: School Spirit Day, College Day, Career Day, Free-Dress Day, etc.)
